

## **Health Matters**

#### Maintain a Healthy Weight:

Extra weight increases your risk for heart disease, diabetes, and high blood pressure. Consult with your physician as to your ideal weight for your age and height. Get to your healthy weight and stay there by eating right and keeping active. Replace sugary drinks with water, which is calorie free.

#### **Immunizations and Health Screenings:**

Stay up-to-date on immunization and other health screenings. By age 50, women should begin mammography screening for breast cancer. Men can be checked for prostate cancer. Both senior men and women should have colonoscopies every 5 to 7 years. Many preventative screenings and vaccinations are available.
