Devices Workshop & Luncheon Info



ARTA Board Makeup

In each issue of HARTA's Newsletter, we include an article on the makeup of the ARTA organization. In this issue we will review the representation of the branches at the Board level and at the AGM. Each Branch is represented by its president at the quarterly Board of Directors'



meetings. At the AGM each Branch is allotted a certain number of voting delegates according to number of voting ARTA members in each Branch. The following is a list of the number of paid up ARTA full Members a branch must have to send the number of delegates indicated to the AGM.

25 to 64 members	President plus one
65 to 109 members	President plus two
110 to 179 members	President plus three
180 to 349 members	President plus four
350 or more	President plus five

There are 18 branches of ARTA, 17 in Alberta and 1 in B.C. The map on the opposite page indicates the location of each branch. At present the list of branches is as follows:

CARTA (Central Alberta Retired Teachers' Association) Takes in the Area Central Alberta near Red Deer

CDRTA (Camrose and District Retired Teachers' Association.) Takes in the area around Camrose and east of Camrose.

CERTA (Central East Retired Teachers' Association) Takes in the around Stettler and East of Stettler)

CRTA (Calgary Retired Teachers' Association) Takes in the city of Calgary as well as the surrounding area.

Elk Island RTA Takes in the Elk Island Region of Alberta. (Sherwood Park, Ft. Saskatchewan, County of Strathcona and point east.)

ERTA (Edmonton Retired Teacher's Association) Takes in the city of Edmonton as well as the surrounding area.

FRTA (Foothills Retired Teachers' Association) Takes in the Foothills School Division and surrounding area.

HARTA (Heartland Alberta Retired Teachers' Association) Takes in the Counties of Brazeau, Leduc and Wetaskiwin and the surrounding area.

MHADRTA (Medicine Hat and District Retired Teachers' Association) Takes in the City of Medicine Hat and the surrounding area

NEARTA (North Eastern Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding St. Paul, Bonnyville, Cold Lake and Lac La Biche.

NWARTA (North Western Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding Grande Prairie, Peace River and areas as far south as Grande Cache.

OKARTA (Okanagan Area Retired Teachers'

Association) Comprises the area surrounding the Okanagan Valley in B.C. This is the only Branch of ARTA in B.C.

PARTA (Parkland Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding the County of Parkland.

SDRTA (Stettler and District Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding Stettler.

STARTA (St. Albert Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding A St. Albert and Sturgeon County.

SWARTA (South Western Alberta Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding Lethbridge as well as areas as far west as Frank and Coaldale.

WCRTA (Wolf Creek Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding the Wolf Creek School Division.

WRTA (Wainwright Retired Teachers' Association) Comprises the area surrounding the town of Wainwright. The orginal ARTA organization was founded in 1963 by the Calgary, Edmonton and Lethbridge. Currently ARTA has grown to more than 20,000 members.
