Gary Sawatzky gave an update on the AR-TA Benefit Plans. First he outlined how to judge whether or not a plan would supply the protection needed. He compared a number of plans with the ARTA Plans and explained how benefits were calculated in each one. He went through the results of the ARTA Plans over the last year. He explained the features of ARTA's Travel Plan. He also answered questions from members. If HARTA members have concerns about their Benefit Plans Gary or other ARTA staff are there to answer their questions.

ARTA AGM Preview

The ARTA AGM will take place from Tuesday, October 1st to Wednesday, October 2nd. Our Branch is permitted to have two delegates to represent the Branch at the AGM. Lawrence Dublenko and Ron Thompson will be the delegates at the ARTA AGM.

Frequently Asked Questions

One of the outcomes of the HARTA AGM was the answers to some questions asked by a member at last year's AGM. The following are the questions with their answers:

- 1. Is a delegate of a Branch permitted to distribute ARTA's AGM Agenda to members of his/her branch who are not delegates to the Provincial ARTA AGM? Agendas for the AGM are emailed to each Branch Delegate. If a Branch member who is not a delegate and wants a copy of the Agenda they must ask one of the Branch's delegates for the agenda or attend the AGM.
- 2. Are the minutes of the AGM available to ARTA members other than delegates to ARTA's AGM? Minutes from the last AGM are available at the currant AGM. Branch members who are not delegates and would like the minutes without attending an AGM would need to attend the

AGM.

- How does a member of a branch bring his/her concerns to ARTA's AGM? A Branch member would bring their concerns to the ARTA AGM by having one of the delegates from their Branch bring them up at ARTA AGM.
- 4. Do our bylaws conform to the Provincial Bylaws re: ARTA Branches? Yes. Section 4 number 6 of Bylaws on Branches says: "6. Branches may set out the criteria for categories of membership in accordance with their own bylaws."
- Is it legal for our Branch to have Teacher and Nonteacher membership in accordance with their own bylaws? Yes, Section 4 number 6 of the ARTA Bylaws on Branches allows each Branch to set their own categories.
- 6. Is our Branch covered by ARTA's blanket insurance liability policy? No, at the request of the Board, our CEO looked into this question and found the policy only applied to the main Association. Currently we are looking to research having such insurance. Stay tuned for further information on this subject.

Confusing Abbreviations

After you retired from teaching you probably noticed a number of abbreviations re: retirement. **ASEBP** (Alberta School Employee Benefits Plan) refers to the health benefits provided by various school districts and which are also available to retired teachers until age 65. The ARTA (Alberta Retired Teachers' Association) Plans, are plans available to all ARTA members and Associate Members. The ATRF (Alberta Teachers' Retirement Fund) is the fund that pays teachers' pensions to retired Alberta teachers. Retired teachers with concerns re: their pensions, should contact the ATRF re: these issues. CPP (Canada Pension Plan) refers to the Pension Plan provided by the Canadian Government. The OAS (Old Age Security) is a supplementary payment to every person over 65 years also created by the Canadian Government. As a review of these abbreviations, I have listed all these abbreviations with their websites where you can get more information on a given topic.
