

The highlight of HARTA's program year is the HARTA Mini-Conference in Leduc. Look for this event and the presenters for this conference on Thursday, May 8th. Please save the date. HARTA has

received its subsidy for 2024 toward the end of November. The subsidy is based on the number of members of our branch who are retired Alberta teachers eligible to receive a pension from the ATRF and who are also members of ARTA.

Upcoming Webinar with ATRF



In collaboration with ARTA, the ATRF (Alberta Teachers' Retirement Fund) is hosting an upcoming webinar for re-

tired members and pension recipients. This onehour presentation will be hosted jointly and cover various topics relevant to your retirement needs. Space is limited, so be sure to register as early as possible!

ATRF will provide information about managing the pension payments, such as banking information and income taxes, as well as provisions of the plan such as cost-of-living adjustments and the 0.6 rule. Information about what happens to your pension when you pass away will also be discussed. ARTA will be discussing the ARTA Benefit Plans, membership eligibility, the application process, and membership advantages. This presentation will be at 9:00 AM on Wednesday, January 8th, 2025.

Is Your HARTA Membership Up-To-Date?

In late November of each year, HARTA will receive a subsidy cheque from ARTA, each year based on the number of paid up ARTA members that are also HARTA members as of September 1st of that year. Each branch president is required to send their list of current members. HARTA's vearly subsidy is based on the number of paid up ARTA members who are retired Alberta teachers who are eligible for an Alberta teachers' pension that the Heartland Branch has. If your membership is due for renewal, you can renew it at a regular HARTA meeting, by sending an e-transfer to: rnthompson102@gmail.com, or by a cheque, or money order payable to HARTA care of HARTA, 4020 -37th Avenue, Leduc, Alberta T9E 6C9. Please make out the cheque, money order, or e-transfer for \$10.00 for each year you would like to renew.

Confusing Abbreviations

After you retired from teaching you probably noticed a number of abbreviations re: retirement. **ASEBP** (Alberta School Employee

Benefits Plan) refers to the health benefits provided by various school districts. The ARTA (Alberta Retired Teachers' Association) **Plans**, are plans available to all ARTA members and Associate Members. The ATRF (Alberta Teachers' Retirement Fund) is the fund that pays teachers' pensions to retired Alberta teachers. Retired teachers with concerns re: their pensions, should contact the ATRF re: these issues. CPP (Canada Pension Plan) refers to the Pension Plan provided by the Canadian Government. The OAS (Old Age Security) is a supplementary payment to every person over 65 years also created by the Canadian Government. As a review of these abbreviations, I have listed all these abbreviations with their websites where you can get more information on a given topic. The ARTCF (Alberta Retired Teachers' Charitable Foundation) is ARTA's foundation to support various partners with their various projects to achieve their goals. AIMCo (Alberta Investment Management Corporation) is the Alberta Government's umbrella Investment Organization which also manages various Government Pensions)


