

In addition to borrowing books, movies, and music, you can do many other things at a public library in Alberta, including:

- \*Take programs: Libraries offer programs for all ages, including classes for upgrading skills, learning new hobbies, and practicing English.
- \*Use the library's computers & Wi-Fi.
- \*Print documents at the library.
- \*Access meeting rooms: Book a meeting room at the library for your business, study group, book club, or other event.
- \*Borrow non-book

items: At some libraries you can borrow items like tools, musical instruments, educational activity kits, art supplies, toys.

- \*Access digital resources: Access digital resources like eBooks, audiobooks, magazines, and newspapers.
- \*Access the Public Library Network: In northern eastern Alberta you can access the Northern Lights Library System.
- \*Attend virtual classes and events: Attend online live classes and events.
- \*Connect with newcomer services: Connect to newcomer service agencies who can help.



#### The Larry Lambert Story

Larry was born in Moose Jaw, SK and raised in the farming community of Eyebrow, SK. Larry was the second of four children born to his parents. Larry's mom was a teacher and his dad was a farm equipment dealer.

Larry went to high school in Wilcox, SK and played hockey for the Notre Dame Hounds, coached by Father Athol Murray. Larry graduated in Wilcox and went on to teacher college in Moose Jaw.

After teaching in Vanguard, SK for two years Larry moved to Alberta in 1960 to play hockey in Drumheller and teach in Delia. He taught in Delia for nine years and became principal. From Delia, Larry went to northern Alberta and was principal in Swan Hills for five years.

In 1972, Larry received his Bachelor of Education degree from the University of Calgary, completing the course work while working and raising a family.

In 1974 Larry moved to St. Paul and stayed. As principal of Ashmont School, his career continued for 19 years, until retirement in 1994. Larry and his family built a wonderful life in St. Paul. He and his wife Louise raised their children and watched their family grow. They became involved in the community, and continue to be active community members, contributing to making lives better in many ways.




"Webster defines gratitude as a feeling of appreciation for a kindness or favour received. I believe that it is more than that. It is an attitude, a way of thinking and living."
