Learn about Digging into the Past of the Peace: Archaeology of Old Bezanson

with Drs. Shawn Morton & Meaghan Peuramaki-Brown



Shawn is an archaeologist and an Anthropology Instructor at Northwestern Polytechnic. His research interests incorporate urban and architectural studies; place-making; survey and visualization.

Meaghan is an archaeologist and Associate Professor at Athabasca University. She specializes in ancient settlement patterns, urbanism, and household activities.

Together, they co-direct the community-engaged Stann Creek Regional Archaeology Project in Belize and Alberta's community-based Old Bezanson Archaeology Project in the Peace Region.

During the summer of 2021, with the aid of community volunteers and the guidance of local historians, an archaeological survey was initiated at the Old Bezanson Townsite with the aim of evaluating the research potential of the site. While the investigation was limited in scope and results preliminary in nature, Drs. Morton and Peuramaki-Brown are eagerly preparing for the next season. 
organizations including Historic Dunvegan and the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum before going to the Archives.

Doug's work experience includes: probation officer and prison caseworker with Alberta Correctional Services; parole officer with the National Parole Service; staff trainer and program director with Native Counselling Services of Alberta; and instructor with MacEwan University. Doug continues to offer his expertise as a consultant specializing in criminal justice education, training, and research.

In 2020, Doug published *Go Ahead and Shoot Me!* "a collection of stories about real people who have been convicted of real crimes and who have been on probation, on parole, or in prison ... all stories show

the human side of criminals not just the nature of the crimes they committed ... there is much more to an offender that just their criminal behavior."

Doug's presentation is based on an article he wrote in 2013 for *Justice Report*, a publication of the *Canadian Criminal Justice Association*, entitled *The Indigenous Experience: Is it Important to Know About This?* His career has been in criminal justice so he will touch briefly on how it is crucial for him at work
