St Alberta and District Further Education is a proud host of the STAR Literacy program. We have worked together for the past 30 years. As required by our clients, we provide adult literacy, numeracy, and basic computer training via one on one tutoring

support from our wonderful volunteer tutor group. We also help prepare individuals for their GED exam for high school equivalency. Tutoring sessions are done in local supportive learning environments for one to one and a half hours a week. Further support is provided to our clients by online learning opportunities. We also provided job, life skills and English language learning opportunities via one in one, or small group sessions to adults 16 plus in St Albert and area. Both men and women tutors with a love of teaching are required for the nine new foundational learners who have recently approached us for help. Tutor training is provided in supportive group sessions. We do not operate during summer months and understand that tutors and learners are not available every week due to winter vacations, weather and life's every day demands, so we are flexible so as to meet our tutor and learners needs.
