Erin Gluck and Meghan Myers will begin with an interactive group activity followed by a presentation on the key environmental issues the City is currently facing, including actions the City is taking and what residents can do to help.

Erin Gluck is currently the Operations Supervisor (Forestry) with Public Works, having worked over the past 26 years at the City in roles with Aquatics, Community Recreation, and Environment. With a background in forestry and education, she looks after the City's Spruce Up St. Albert program, Grey Nuns White Spruce Park Working Group, and school education programs related to environment topics. She lives in the Lacombe Park area and spends a lot of time exploring the City's trail and park system with her husband and two young daughters.

Meghan Myers started with the City in 2006 in a role that supported the corporation (internal processes and operations) and community outreach. Meghan is currently the Environmental Coordinator - Community Strategy and Engagement, which, as the position title defines, focusses on community and public engagement activities for the Environment branch. She develops and monitors the Environmental Master Plan including programs and initiatives, coordinate the Environmental Initiatives Grant Program, and facilitate the Environmental Advisory Committee. Although Meghan grew up in St. Albert, she now lives in the Woodcroft community of Edmonton with her husband and two young sons.

2019 Federal Election: Seniors' Issues

What will you be asking your local candidate? What information will be useful in assessing the positions of the various parties? The Canadian Association of Retired Teachers* has identified four issues that may be relevant to you.

- Making Retirement Income More Secure
 - Key Message: Canadians deserve a secure and dignified retirement, with a guaranteed and sufficient source of income
- National Pharmacare
 - Key Message: All Canadian should have access to the medications they need. A
 universal, public, comprehensive, accessible and portable national Pharmacare
 program would cut costs and lead to a healthier population.
- Opposition to Privatization of Medical Services
 - Key Message: Access to medical support should not be dictated by an individual's means to pay.
 - Medicare is based on five principles contained in the Canada Health Act: public administration, universal access, comprehensive coverage, accessibility without extra charges or discrimination and portability across the provinces.
- National Seniors Strategy
 - Key Message: Canada needs a National Seniors Strategy that optimizes health, financial security, affordable housing and social inclusion so all Canadians can age with dignity.

For each of these issues, this organization has have identified three topics:
