Looking Back: Breakfast held on Oct. 28th

Guest speakers Jeanne Boutin, Leo Bruseker and Sandy Fildes greeted us with the phrase "Buen Camino" and took us on a tour of Lourdes, Fatima and parts of the Camino Trail.

But the introduction included telling of delayed flights and missing luggage – headaches they had in common with thousands of other travelers this year. Fortunately, they managed to have a very interesting trip in spite of these challenges.

First to Lourdes, France where they visited an underground cathedral that can accommodate an astonishing 25,000 people! Actually, there are many religious facilities in this city, including 3 Basilicas. They were charmed by the friendliness of fellow travelers and of the citizens of Lourdes who are known for showing kindness to the many pilgrims who visit there.

Next stop: Fatima, Portugal. It was here that three young children were said to have seen an apparition of Mary, mother of Jesus. It is a story deemed by the Catholic Church to be "worthy of belief". As such it is a place of pilgrimage for thousands of people each year.

And now to El Camino de Santiago in northern Spain. Legend has it that the remains of the Apostle St. James the Great were buried in the Cathedral and discovered by a shepherd in the 9th century. The city of Santiago is named after St. James: Santiago de Compostela means St. James of the Field of Stars. It has been a destination for pilgrims for centuries.

The greeting "Buen Camino" means "Good Way" or "Good Walk" and is used by pilgrims as they make their way to Santiago. The Camino de Compostela routes are a network of many different paths, all leading pilgrims to the city of Santiago de Compostela.
