ARTA: If you have not yet done so, check out ARTA RX Pharmacy

ARTARX was designed to support members in their prescription needs. It was also designed to reduce premiums paid on prescription medications, meaning that members save on individual prescriptions and the overall plan benefits from reduced costs from reimbursing claims.

Since January 9 this year, the pharmacy has been providing clinical care and dispensing services to ARTA members. By June 30 it had generated \$803,851 in sales and collected \$145, 610 in dispensing fees and upcharges.
