You will need to make an appointment and visit the ARTA pharmacy to receive the shot. If you choose to go to a different pharmacy, your ARTA benefits will cover 80% of the cost.





Do you know of this gem? We had never heard of it. Located approximately 25 kilometers west of Turner Valley, it is definitely off the beaten path.





We set off on a glorious Friday summer morning and made our way to Sandy McNabb Campground, a reservation-only campground. It was the most scenic, private, and well-laid out group campground we had ever seen. There were approximately 15 spacious, serviced campsites, a covered shelter and toilets arranged around a large oval grassed area. There were no other campers within our sight or hearing—it felt like we "owned" that little piece of heaven!



There are several other group sites and individual camping sites in the area. It is an easy walk to the Sandy McNabb Interpretive Trail and a pleasant, scenic drive to Sheep River Falls.
