March Breakfast Presentation in Review by Ardyth Garrison

Gary Gagnon and the Braided Journey Program

From Edmonton Catholic Schools website: "Braided Journeys Student Support Centres are committed to assisting student success by cultivating a caring, welcoming, and positive place where Indigenous students see themselves, their contributions, and their culture represented, respected, and celebrated. Each centre offers support, encouragement, and guidance throughout a student's educational journey."

Gary Gagnon shared some of his personal journey with us at our March meeting to help us understand the need for and genesis of this program.

The Gagnon family has very deep roots in our area–as far back as the mid-1800s. His Kokum (grandmother) lived to be 105–always in St Albert. He told of family trips when he was a child to a cabin where they hunted and prepared meat. They were proudly indigenous and were learning the traditional ways. But at that time the children were discouraged from speaking of their background at school.

He reminisced about a favourite teacher who shared her soup with him every day. And also another who told him he would never amount to anything. As well there was a story of an administrator who made a "deal" with him that greatly improved his attendance–and no doubt his academic success! He was one of 5 school graduates from his indigenous family.

Gary shared with us some of the important things he has learned:

- Humour is very important
- That having a disability doesn't mean you can't learn it just means it takes longer
- It is better to be of service than be served
- You need love
- You remember the good teacher with you head, your mind and your heart.

He said "I was loved and I want to share love. I want to bring stories of hope and love to these students"

The Braided Journeys program started at Ben Calf Robe School as a lunch and learn program. It is now widely available across the district. It includes indigenous theology and encourages the use of indigenous languages. It promotes healthy relationships and provides culturally safe spaces and supports for transitions in students' lives.

In closing he stated that reconciliation is missing a 'u'. If you put "you" in reconciliation, good things will come of "recounciliation! And finally: "Don't fear the Journey".
